Provides \$20 million of funding for municipal roads, sidewalks, and bridges



Program funding consists of a 67% local contribution with a 33% match provided by the state



The first \$5 million of funding is distributed equally, with each municipality eligible for \$128,205



The remaining \$15 million is distributed proportionately based on each municipality's share of non-federally eligible lane miles



Roads

- Mill and overlay
- Crack seal
- Chip seal

Sidewalks

- Replacement

ADA Compliance

- Public rights-of-way and facilities are required to be accessible for all users regardless of funding source
- Projects requiring pedestrian accessibility include new construction and projects altering existing street and highway facilities
- Municipalities shall at a minimum, follow RIDOT's Policies, Procedures and Standards with respect to ADA compliance

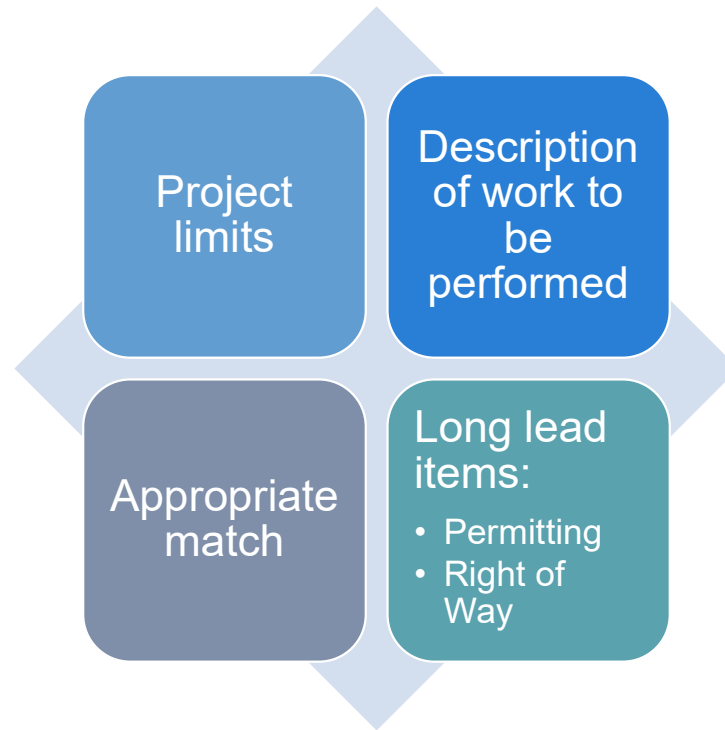
Applications are due by October 15, 2023

- Conformance to Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP)
- Feasibility of meeting deadlines associated with funding
