Dear Secretary Buttigieg:

I am reaching out to express my unwavering endorsement and to underscore the importance of the Rhode Island Department of Transportation's (RIDOT) FY2025-2026 Multimodal Project Discretionary Grant Application to advance "Full Replacement of the I-195 Washington Bridge" project application. The application is requesting \$220.9 million in grant support from the National Infrastructure Project Assistance (Mega) program. This grant would contribute towards the total project cost of \$368.3 million.

On December 11th, my administration took emergency measures to close Washington Bridge No. 700 (Westbound) upon receiving notification of critical failures in certain bridge components. This closure, coupled with ensuing traffic challenges, has profoundly impacted the neighboring communities spanning from East Providence to Providence. In response to the closure, my administration has made significant strides to alleviate the situation, including the expansion of traffic capacity, heightened enforcement efforts, and the proposal of a budget amendment to alleviate the financial burdens on local small businesses in the area. However, until the bridge is rebuilt, congestion challenges, safety concerns, and economic impacts will remain.

Looking ahead, expediting the construction of a new bridge to replace the current westbound structure stands as my utmost priority. The demolition, design, and construction phases of this project require substantial investment from our federal partners. The \$220.9 million of funding requested in this application is a critical component of the comprehensive financial package aimed at the construction of a new bridge. As you noted during your visit to Rhode Island to tour the bridge, this project "can't get done without a lot of federal funding."

Constructing this new bridge will address immediate concerns, as the closure affects over 90,000 vehicles daily. It will also foster employment opportunities and put Rhode Islanders to work. Ultimately, this proposal will result in the construction of a brand-new bridge that stands as a testament to our commitment to quality infrastructure, ensuring the safety and convenience of generations to come.



Hundreds of businesses have applied to the SBA low interest loan program as a result of the bridge closure. The negative impacts on the business community from the bridge closure have been compared to the impacts suffered by the business community as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic,

On behalf of Quonset Development Corporation, I write to you in full support of RIDOT's FY2025-2026 Multimodal Project Discretionary Grant Application to advance "Full Replacement of the I-195 Washington Bridge" project application. The application seeks \$220.9 Million in Congestion Relief Program Grant support against a total project cost of \$368 Million.

The Quonset Business Park is an economic engine for the State of Rhode Island and southern New England, home to over 200 businesses and 14,000 employees. The Park contains the State's only publicly-owned port, the Port of Davisville, which is one of the nation's largest importer of new automobiles. A 2023 study shows that the Park directly and indirectly supports 24,681 jobs, which represents 5% of the total employment in Rhode Island, and produces \$5.9 billion in economic output and \$1.72 billion in household income annually. One out of every five manufacturing jobs in Rhode Island lies within the Park, and the average wage at the Park is 10% higher than the Rhode Island average.
